EL FLACO, by Quarry, won the \$75,000 Parfaitment Stakes at Philadelphia Park on November 2, 2009. The two year old who is owned by Sajor Stable and trained by Murray Rojas dueled off the rail, regained the lead in early stretch to win by 2 3/4 lengths. Congratulations to trainer Murray Rojas, breeder Xanthus Farms, Inc. and stallion owner Tea Party Stables (Walter Downey). We love seeing our clients doing well!

RUN A BUCK, by Hard Buck (BRZ), vied for the lead early on the inside rail and drew clear under a light ride by Robby Albarado to win by 2 1/2 lengths in his first start on April 22nd at Keeneland. He made it look easy for trainer Wayne Catalano and owner Dare to Dream Stable, LLC. Run A Buck was a yearling purchase made by Karen Godsey.

TOMAC, by Black Tie Affair, won a Maiden Special Weight at Charles Town on October 4th in a winning time of 52.26 for owner/breeder Mr. & Mrs. Paul M. Brown, Sr. of Hanover, Virginia. TOMAC set the pace along the rail, drew clear down the backstretch and held sway under a steady drive through the lane. In his next race, TOMAC won by 5 1/2 lengths at Charles Town on November 8th in a time of 51.82 for the 4 1/2 furlong Allowance race.

RISKY RED, by Devil His Due, broke his maiden at Laurel Park on January 21st for owner Marshall E. Dowell and trainer Robbie Bailes. Risky Red was four wide the first turn, settled back off the dueling leaders, commenced a four wide run nearing the final turn and dueled into the stretch to eventually pull away and win by 6 1/4 lengths in the 1 1/16 mile race. Risky Red was then just beat a nose on April 5th at Philadelphia Park.

LION ON THE RUN, by Lionhearted, broke his maiden at Charles Town on December 10 when he stalked the pace and responded when sat down for the drive. The lucky Mr. Jim Arrison of Virginia is the owner and breeder of this winner.

~ A Virginia Bred, SOUTHERN CAVALIER, by Pleasant Dancer, won at Penn National on November 11th for owner and breeder George Sheehan of Colorado. Flint Stites trained the winner who won by 3 1/2 lengths.

~ BLUEMONT'S GIRL, by Way West (FR), broke her maiden for owner and breeder James L. Driver of Virginia. The dark bay filly won at Penn National on October 24th . The filly won again on March 31st at Charles Town.

~ STATE REP, by Full Dress Blues, broke his maiden by 6 1/2 lengths for owner/breeder Tea Party Stable, Inc. of Boston on October 31st at Suffolk Downs.

~ DYLAN MY VILLAIN, by Black Tie Affair, added another win for owner Keith Early and breeders Carl Buhr, Keith Early, and Mark Deane at Charles Town on January 22nd.

~ AGAVE RIDGE, by Cactus Ridge, won at Charles Town on October 15th for owners PTK of Virginia.

~ GEAUX BAYOU, by Dream Run, broke his maiden on December 1st at Beulah Park. He had a second on February 19th then came back with another win on March 1st. Now that he has it figured out, he won again on March 22nd.

~ GODSEY, by Dream Run, broke his maiden going six furlongs at Laurel Park on St. Patrick's Day for owner Clive Black of Chesapeake, Virginia. GODSEY again took the outside and circled the field for a 5 3/4 length win at Pimlico on April 24th.

~DANCED ALL NIGHT at Laurel Park on April 3rd when the Jazz Club filly dug in to prevail.

~CAUNOTAUCARIUS won on April 9th at Penn National, the Crowd Pleaser colt had a second in his first start for owner George Sheehan of Colorado. Caunotaucarius was the name of the Indian scout for George Washington.

~SWINGAMOUNGTHESTARS– broke her maiden for PTK,LLC at Pimlico on April 29th.
