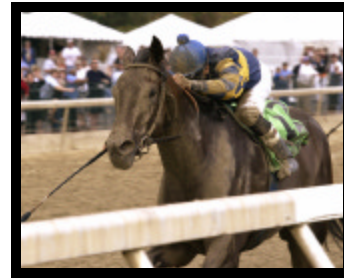

EAGLE POINT GRADUATES AT MARYLAND MILLION

NOVEMBER 2003

IRISH COLONY won the \$50,000 Maryland Million Starter Handicap on October 11th at Laurel. The race report said **IRISH COLONY** broke from the outside, angled over to the rail, was reserved early, split rivals and rallied up on the rail late to win by 1/2 length. Ryehill Farm owns the three year old gelding by Larrupin' out of Neat and Pleasant. **IRISH COLONY** was broken and trained at Eagle Point Farm where he was remembered as a tall lanky two year old. Ron Cartwright trains the Stakes winner. **IRISH COLONY** won in July at Colonial Downs, then won again in August when he led all the way and won by 13 lengths and "drew off to an insurmountable advantage." On September 17th, the Larrupin' offspring won again at Pimlico. After winning the stakes race Irish Colony ran second in an allowance race at Laurel after being bumped at the start and advancing three wide. And yet again Irish Colony won an 1 1/16 mile allowance at Laurel on November 8, 2003. Congratulations to Ryehill Farm, Ron Cartwright, Eric Rodriquez, and **IRISH COLONY**.

Grant's Moon a two year old filly by Malibu Moon ran second in the \$100,000 Maryland Million Lassie Stakes for owners Kevin Burton, and Donovan Haughton who also trains the big striding filly. **Grant's Moon** received her final training at Eagle Point before going to the race track. On September 17th the filly broke her maiden at Pimlico in 1 1/16 mile Maiden Special Race. Not to be outdone she follows up her stakes placed performance with an allowance win by 5 1/4 length at Laurel on October 29, 2003. She was rated back off rivals, angled out, took command and pulled away. Congratulations to her owners Kevin Burton, Donovan Haughton (owner and trainer) and to **Grant's Moon**.

IRISH WARNING-2000 bay colt by Larrupin' out of Bewarned added a couple of wins at Delaware Park for owner Dan Ryan and trainer Mike Pino. On September 3rd, Irish Warning drew off when roused in a six furlong race. And then came back on September 20th to win by three on the dirt at Delaware Park. Could this be the start of another Roll.

Disearnment, 2000 bay gelding by Awad, broke his maiden at Penn National for owner Dan Ryan on August 27th and a second at Delaware on September 30th.

Lightning Echo, by Western Echo, added another win on September 8, 2003 at Philadelphia Park.

Joe Can't Quit ran second in an allowance race at Penn National for owner Dan Ryan and Flint Stites, trainer.

Double Reward chestnut filly by Genuine Reward keeps picking up the checks for breeder, owner, and trainer Homer Haiber of Farmville, Virginia. She ran second at Laurel on October 23rd.

Chuckels by Editor's Note was beat a neck at Delaware on October 14th in a six furlong race for owner and breeder Stanley Stables..

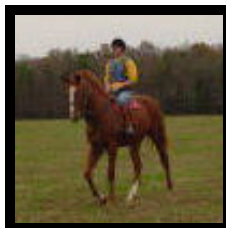
Foreign Cash by Leo Castelli bred by Marshall Dowell won by 5 1/4 lengths at Charles Town on November 12th, second on October 15h

The filly by Thirty Eight Paces was sold at the yearling sales because she had a parrot mouth You wouldn't notice it unless you opened her mouth. At the farm she was one of the breakers who you never knew was here. She always did everything right, not a bit of trouble. Well she did everything right at the track also. **THIRTY EIGHT GO GO** was Champion Maryland bred two year old filly in 1987 when she won the USF&G Maryland Lassie Stakes , as well as the Gardenia (gr. II), Tempted S. (gr. II), Geisha H., All Brandy H., 2nd Ladies Handicap (gr. I), Black Eyed Susan S. (gr. II), State of Maryland Distaff, Md. Juvenile Filly Champ, Smart Angle S. **THIRTY EIGHT GO GO** won \$871,229 for owners Morgan and Janet Wayson and trainer King T. Leatherbury.

Starlite Dust returned to the track after some R &R at Eagle Point and won by 3 1/4 lengths at Laurel in a six furlong race on October 20, 2003 for owner Four Sisters Stable.

Warm Up by Larrupin' added another win on August 27th at Timonium for Ryehill Farm and trainer King Leatherbury This was one of **Leatherbury's 6000 win**. Congratulations King!
