We have been busy at Eagle Point Farm this fall. They say a farmers work is never done. On a farm there is always maintenance and repairs to be done. Some projects have been completed such as replacing and hanging new gates, spraying and cleaning off the fence line, installing new automatic waterers, and redoing partitions. Then there are big projects such as our brand new wood flooring for our manure conveyor system which is unseen but greatly appreciated by our stable hands. Some more noticeable projects are our road to the racetrack which has been built up with dirt, the drainage ditch replaced with an underground system,



and repairing the lane to the river lot. The racetrack has had its annual leveling and maintenance work. The latest major project has been the sandblasting, painting, re-padding and wiring of our starting gates. We now have an automated starting gate with a **BELL**. What a great addition! Eagle Point will be able to do serious gate training at the farm which will speed up the time needed at the racetrack.

2. **FIRST** in a Allowance race by one length at Pimlico on November 5th—when he settled off the rail, advanced at the 5/16 pole, swinging five wide, upper stretch and drew clear.
3. **FIRST** in the \$100,000 Charles H. Hadry Stakes at Pimlico on November 20th at Pimlico by 1 1/2 length. **IRISH COLONY** was rated close inside, angled out at the 1/4 pole, three wide bid, drew clear driving. Ryehill Farm bred and owns the stakes winner by Larrupin', Ron Cartwright is the trainer and Steve Hamilton is the jockey.

Mark and Cindy Stewart of California and Virginia had a successful first showing as breeders when their Virginia bred Broken Vow out of Beautiful Sunshine by Gilded Time sold at the November Keeneland Sale for \$40,000. The 2004 colt was foaled and raised at Eagle Point Farm.

MIS WES– 2001 by Wayne County, ends her 2004 season with an Allowance win at Pimlico going one mile on the turf winning by one length. She worked between horses, drifted wide and drew clear. Mr. And Mrs. O. J. Peterson III are owners and breeders of this winning filly who is trained by Rodney Jenkins. Mis Wes had a second in an allowance race on September 26th. Presently, Mis Wes is enjoying some R & R at Eagle Point before going home for the holidays. In February she returns to training at Eagle Point to prep for the 2005 season.

RED GULCH– 2001 chestnut colt by Gulch out of Political Bluff breaks his maiden at Pimlico. He was three wide, steadied in tight quarters midway on first turn, advanced along rail, eased back and taken outside entering the turn, bid for the lead entering the stretch, dueled and proved best for owners Robert Gerczak and Kaygar Stables and trainer Carlos Gracia.

Tayazi by Larrupin' breaks her maiden at Delaware on September 5th for owner Dan Ryan, Mike Pino trainer.

Tiffany's Boot by Storm Boot won by one length at Delaware on October 6th for owner Tae Shin and trainer Maria Virginia-Pascual.

Cobbley's Pride, 2001 by Tom Cobbley, won by 4 3/4 lengths in a 6 furlong race at Delaware on October 4th for owner / breeders Michael and Heidi Overfelt of Bedford, Virginia.

Solitarius , 2001 filly by Diamond ran two wide, dueled, opened up in the lane , and dug in late to prevail in her win on November 11th. Owners are K.C. Farms and trainer is Carlos Gracia.

Pleasant Hope, 1999 by Pleasant Dancer advanced three wide to win at Charles Town on September 11th by 3 1/2 lengths for owner Carlton Southworth. Local jockey Shannon Campbell rode the winner trained by Mary Sue Query.

Blythewood, 2000 by Root Boy added another win at Charles Town when she held clear with steady urging. Mrs. Frank P. Wright bred the winner.

Mitote Maya by Polish Numbers adds a win at Charles Town on November 19th in a 1 1/16 race for owner and breeder Ryver Meadow Farm.

Punitive, 2001 Larrupin' gelding won by 4 1/2 lengths on November 21st for owner and breeder Daniel Ryan.

Starlite Dust 1999 by Flying Chevron won on November 16th at Charles Town by 4 1/2 lengths.

O'Ririn 1998 by Smarten scores another win at Penn National in a mile race on the turf on September 2nd.

Leapshin 1998 by Finocchio won at Great Lakes Down on August 23rd in a six furlong race for breeder Dave Belknap.

GOOD SECONDS: United Notion, 2001 by Malibu Moon , just missed in a MSW on August 26th, September 12, and again in October for owner/ breeder Mrs. Frank P. Wright. Mrs. Wright's A Firm Bridge by Peteski lost by a nose on November 5th. A Firm Bridge is known for his extremely large ears—shame it wasn't his nose!

J.R. Shadow Dancer by Pleasant Dancer finished a game second at Penn National on August 26th.

Cajun Soup by Alphabet Soup finished a good second first time back in an allowance race at Charles Town on November 6th for owner John Hartman.

Hanover Wharf by Bowler's Wharf was beat a neck in her first race back at Charles Town on November 18th when she closed in a rush for owner Denise Franklin.
