At Saratoga, Eternal Prince was running in the A Phenomen Stakes. The night before the race, Steinbreiner came by the Hurst rental house for a visit. As soon as he walked in the door my son Michael, who was three at the time, grabbed him by the hand and insisted that he see the cool house we were staying in. So in tow by my son and followed by 2 two year old children, Bo Hurst and Karen Dennehy, he was given a tour of the entire house. He was very accommodating and did the whole tour. After that I had a different opinion of George Steinbreiner. Eternal Prince was also a resident at Eagle Point Farm!

Blessed Soul, by Perfect Soul (IRE), won at Delaware Park on July 22nd. She made a bid three wide into the stretch, then dueled late to edge clear. The chestnut filly added another win on September 18th at Laurel Park going 1 1/16 mile when she closed determinedly. Blessed Soul also was second on August 31st at Delaware Park and on October 21st at Laurel

~ PTK, LLC had a couple of wins with Swingamongthestars, by Crypto Star, who held sway under a drive to win at Colonial Downs on May 30th. Another PTK winner was Agave Ridge, by Cactus Ridge, who won at Laurel Park on August 6th and was second on September 5th at Timonium and then won again at Laurel Park on October 14th.

~ Jim Arrison's homebred's make the front of the newsletter again! Misty's Rebellion, by Lion Hearted, broke her maiden on May 27th, then added another win on September 3rd, both wins were at Charles Town. Her older sister, Misty's Dispute, by Domestic Dispute, won again on August 15th at Laurel Park when she romped by 6 lengths and another win at Laurel Park on October 21st. Seasonality, by Rossini, broke his maiden at Charles Town on September 16th after running second on June 6th, July 2nd, and August 28th.

In his second start on July 22nd, Rocky Valay, by Quarry, broke his maiden at Penn National. Rocky Valay set the pace from the start, saved ground through the far turn then finished under left handed urging. MountainView Racing LLC is the owner, Xanthus Farms Inc. is the breeder, and Walter Downey is the stallion owner. Congrats to all! Risky Red, by Devil His Due, won at Colonial Downs on June 28th for owner Marshall E. Dowell and trainer W. R. Bailes.

Change My Number, by Changeintheweather, broke his maiden on July 9th at Philadelphia Park when he was three wide and rallied to draw clear. Change my Number is owned by Silver Trail Stables LLC ( Dennis Tanchek) and bred by Xanthus Farms, Inc.

HO HUM HO, by Civilisation, won on June 24th for owner, Steve Reggets. HO HUM HO set a pressured pace along the rail, drew out the final quarter mile and was under vigorous rousing through the stretch to win by 8 1/4 lengths to break his maiden at Charles Town.

MYSTIC GOLD, by Domestic Dispute, broke her maiden at Delaware Park on June 14th in a mile dirt race for owner Felix Susi LLC. MYSTIC GOLD moved close leaving the far turn, ran down the leader with a furlong remaining then held off her rival for the win.

MOON JAM, by Duckhorn, added another win on July 20th at Philadelphia Park when she vied for command inside, shook loose and drew clear. Xanthus Farms, Inc. is the breeder.

TRIPLEKIN, by Makin, won at Clemmons on May 8th. Jill Gordon-Moore of Virginia is the breeder.

GHOST MARK by Luhuk won at Charles Town on June 10th for owner Clive Black of Chesapeake, Virginia.

The bay colt set the pace and finished under steady urging on October 1st at Penn National to add another win and then was second on June 26th.

PROUD MELODY, by Proud Citizen, broke her maiden going five furlongs at Presque Isle Downs on September 1st for owner Brian Poe. Proud Melody was allowed to settle, made a steady advance, was five wide and able to get up in the final strides. The filly was second at Thistledown on August 17th. On October 5th at Mountaineer Park, the bay filly dug in from the fourth path down the lane holding off an inside challenge for another win.

LASTCHANCESHELLY, by Beautiful Indy, broke her maiden on September 13th at Delaware Park for trainer John Scanlan, owner Patrick Scanlan, and breeder and stallion owner Daniel Borislow. The filly was well placed close to the pace and ran down the leader to win going away. Previously she was second at Penn National on June 24th, July 17th, and August 7th.

BEDFORD ARCH, by Smoke Glacken, won a 1 mile 70 yards race at Suffolk Downs on September 15th and also on October 11th.

PRETTY VICTORY, by Victory Gallop, broke her maiden at Mountaineer on September 26th.
