The Virginia bred, Money'sbaby broke his two year old maiden on December 12, 1999 at Laurel. The bay colt by Eternal Orage out of Dance for Money led all the way in winning for his owner and breeder Carl Jenkins of Montpelier, Virginia. The trainer of the winner is Valora A. Testerman. This "hope" from our 1997 foal crop was foaled and broken at Eagle Point Farm..

After finding her winning ways— Terms of Endearment , dark brown filly 1994 by Private Terms won a race at Charles Town on December 2, 1999 for owners Elmon Gray of Waverly and Eagle Point Farm. Jeff Runco was the trainer. The filly won easily after being left at the gate. She was claimed from that race. She returned on December 12, 1999 at Charles Town and won again for her new owners.
