THE NICEST HORSES TO HAVE ARE THE CONSISTENT ONES!

-**Grasshoppin**, by Cat Thief, placed second in the \$100,000 Swatara S. Listed Stakes at Penn National on November 23rd after being bumped. On December 20th he won a \$77,290 Allowance Race at Parx Racing when he took the lead in deep stretch. Traveling to Aqueduct on January 14th, **Grasshoppin** rallied for the place in the \$125,000 Jazil Stakes. Picking up checks at different tracks with total earnings of \$344,080 for owner and breeder Michael Jester.

-Another traveling check getter is NEXT BEST THING, by Stephen Got Even. The bay mare won at Parx Racing on January 17th when she saved ground and won under strong handling. She was then second at Penn National on February 17th. Next she won on a raise in allowance company at Laurel Park on March 4th. She was bumped leaving the gate, recovered and pulled her way forward. Her total lifetime earnings are now \$331,802.

-Representing the two year olds is **UNAQUOI**, by Gattapardo, who was third in the \$75,000 West Virginia Triple Crown Nutrition Breeders Classic Stakes on October 8th at Charles Town. The filly shipped to Laurel Park and added an allowance win on November 5th on the turf when she was kept to business in the drive. Back at Charles Town **UNAQUOI** was second in the \$50,000 Eleanor Casey Memorial Stakes for owner and breeder Ray Pennington III. This impressive filly also won her owners a \$15,000 bonus for being the first winner and first stakes winner from the stallion syndicate of Gattapardo!!

-**AWESOME MADDI C**, by Horse Greeley, has been on a tear this fall with wins on September 14th at Mountaineer, October 1st a win in an allowance race, October 24th a win in a starter optional claiming, November 16th another allowance win and then traveled to Mahoning Valley to finish the year with a win in a starter allowance race on December 12th. She won 9 races in 2016 and was third in the nation in number of wins. She is back at it in 2017 with a second in an allowance race where she was beat by a neck. This very consistent mare has lifetime stats of 26 starts, 12 wins, 6 seconds and 3 thirds.

-**SHEPHERD'S PRIDE**, by Charitable Man, had wins at Zia Park on October 9th, November 7th and December 11th to finish the year with six wins. He ended up 51st in the nation in number of wins. James L. Driver is the breeder of this consistent fellow.

-**CONCORDIA'S WAY**, by Concord Point, broke his maiden on October 8th at Laurel Park with an eight length win after being steadied when full of run behind horses entering the turn. In an allowance race at Laurel on December 4th, **CONCORDIA'S WAY** kicked clear at the end for the win. Back in an allowance race at Laurel Park on December 9th, the gray gelding won again by 7 1/4 lengths. Sam E. English II is the owner and breeder.

TWO YEAR OLD WINNERS:

BRAXTON, by Peak Dancer, owned and bred by Eagle Point Farm won his first time out in a Maiden Special at Charles Town by 5 1/4 lengths. Our special homebred, named after the late James Braxton who groomed his mother, had us all screaming from the rail! What a thrill!

Another VA Bred, **HATTERAS BOUND**, by Redeemed, owned and bred by Douglas K. Daniels won in his second start in a Maiden Special at Charles Town on October 22nd by four lengths. The big bay came back with another win at Laurel Park on December 3rd. He and Braxton were weaned, raised and trained together!

JOHN ROOT, by Limehouse, won by ten lengths when he engaged in a four way duel and then drew clear to increase his lead for owner and breeder Ray M. Pennington III.

SAINT MAIN EVENT, by Redeemed, broke her maiden at Parx Racing on December 2nd by a neck for owner and breeder Daniel W. McDonnell when she was up in late stages.

SCARLET'S RANSOM, by Denis of Cork, broke her maiden at Laurel Park on December 26th for owners and breeders Nancy and Eric Rizer. The dark brown filly accelerated to the early lead then was allowed to relax the final sixteenth for a 5 1/4 length win.

MOE TROUBLE, by Uncle Mo, won a Maiden Special Weight at Parx Racing on December 20th for owner and breeder Michael W. Jester. He settled outside the pacesetters, bid wide and then edged away through the stretch for the win. **MOE TROUBLE** won again in an Allowance race at Parx Racing on March 13th. The chart says he quickly went to the front and was well handled setting the pace then drew away to prove clearly best in handy fashion. He won by five lengths.

ROBEY'S BOY, by Maybry's Boy, bred by Dave Hill and owned by The Mares of Diomedes was four deep leaving the backstretch, secured command leaving the bend, was under the whip twice in the stretch and pulled away for a 12 1/4 length lead at Laurel Park on February 19th.

MORE WINNERS!!!

FLASHY KYEM, by Medallist, won an allowance race at Parx Racing on October 10th for breeders McConnell, Gelman, and Vosters and for owner Daniel McConnell and Lee H. Vosters with a well placed off the dueling leaders trip then moved easily to the front at the top of the stretch to hold out for the win.

R. JOLLY DREAMER, by Sahara Heat, won at the Meadowlands on September 29 for breeder Kevin Cassidy and owners Roberta McAllister and Kevin Cassidy when he waited for running room and surged late outside for the win. The gray gelding added another win at Parx Racing on January 10th under a long drive to win by a head. On February 21st at Parx Racing R. JOLLEY DREAMER won after falling back early, then came back to take the lead and win going away.

SALLY OH SALLY, by Sharp Humor, keeps adding to her earnings with a win at the Meadowlands on October 7th. She loves the turf and won again at Laurel Park on October 16th when she saved ground and took command outside the duelers and drove clear.

COWBOY'S PRINCESS, by Cowboy Cal, won at Gulfstream Park West on November 2nd for owner Dexter Craigie, Jr. when she fought to the wire to win by a nose.

WIZOFWALLSTREET, by Andiron, broke his maiden at Penn National on November 17th for owners Mountain view Racing LLC and Hooper Racing Stable LLC when he broke slowly then closed between horses and was up late. The same owner had another winner with BA BA BARBARA ANN, by Wiseman's Ferry, who won at Charles Town on December 8th when she saved ground, took the lead, dueled clear, and held on.

AWAKE THE DAY, by More Than Ready, won at Laurel Park for breeder and owner Sam E. English II on November 19th. She set the pace and opened up turning for home and lasted under pressure to win by a nose.

BOURBON AND BEER, by Pioneer of the Nile, broke his maiden for owner and breeder Sam E. English II at Laurel Park on December 16th. He bore in at the break, raced three wide and prevailed.

Another Sam E. English owned and bred winner was TIZ UNBEATABLE, by Tiz Wonderful, who won at Laurel Park on January 21st when he drove clear late.

KADIE'S HORSEPLAY, by Outflanker, won for breeder James F. Thames and owner Horseplay Racing at Laurel Park on December 3rd. The filly stalked the pace, was three wide and closed inside for the win.

HADEEA, by Misbah, won at Penn National on December 9th when he was bumped entering the first turn, moved to stalk, sent to a short lead and was kept to a drive. HADEEA added another win on March 5th at Laurel Park when he moved clear under confident handling and maintained a comfortable advantage while kept to task.

SILVERSCREENACTRES, by Eurosilver, bred by Hidden Hollow Farm broke her maiden at Parx Racing on December 11th when she drew away in the stretch under moderate urging to win by 8 1/4 lengths.

NOT A SECRET, by Orientate, found the winners circle at Charles Town on January 28th for breeder Charles M. Wilson and owner Ray M. Pennington III with a 6 1/2 length win. NOT A SECRET quickly took control to rate a clear pace inside under a mild hand ride rounding the far turn then moderately handled through the lane for a 6 1/2 length win.

TACTICAL PLAN, by Cat Thief, who is bred and owned by Michael Jester, won an allowance race at Penn National with a four length victory after being caught in tight behind horses then sent to the front and widened with steady riding.

FLASHY MEDAL, by Medalist, broke her maiden for breeder Gelman, McConnell and Vosters and owners Daniel McConnell and Lee Vosters when she stayed out from the inside and drew away for a 5 length win at Penn National on September 29th.

CAPTIVATING KO KO, by Sharp Humor, broke his maiden on October 5th at Charles Town for owner Jeevan R. Mathura by 7 1/4 lengths.

ANDY'S LOVE, by Andiron, won at Penn National when in good position, took over in midstretch and drew clear at Penn National on October 12th.

PERRY M, by Purge, won at Mahoning Valley Race Course on November 21st.

CRAZY BERNICE, by Outflanker, broke her maiden at Laurel Park on January 28th for breeder Pam Michael and owner Horseplay Racing and Pam Michaels. The bay filly chased the pace two wide, gained the lead mid stretch and edged clear.

RUNNING FOR RYAN, by Astrology, broke his maiden for owner Brown Dog Racing Stable at Parx Racing on March 7th. He raced in the four path, circled rivals in the final turn, angled in and was just up.
