GOING FOR THE GOLD

Karen Dennehy Godsey had another good meet at Colonial Downs. She had 5 wins, 10 seconds, and 12 thirds. Just like in the Olympics, silver is good and you are happy with bronze because you're at least on the podium, but you always want the gold! KISSER N RUN, by Pleasant Tap, won back to back races on the turf. Previously, in 5 lifetime starts, the filly was beat 16, 35, 17, 26, 21, and 40 lengths. With a few changes, KISSER N RUN broke her maiden on June 9th at Colonial Downs when she was jostled at the gate, steadied in close quarters in first turn, lost ground on far turn after running over a goose and then won by 3 1/4 lengths. In her next start against winners, KISSER N RUN was forwardly placed on the rail, backed herself off the pace then came back up the rail with a rally for a 1 1/2 length win on June 28th for owner Teddy Alexander of Florida.

SALLY OH SALLY, by Sharp Humor, broke her maiden on June 29th when she won by a head in an exciting duel up the stretch. RMR Stables (Mark and Cindy Stewart) of Powhatan own SALLY OH SALLY who also added two exciting seconds and a third for the meet. Yes Mark, you finally made the newsletter!!!

MUSIC OF ARABIA, by Bernstein, broke her maiden and her owner's, Charles Wilson of Ashland, on July 12th. The filly moved clear past the 5/16th pole and won by 2 3/4 lengths. She also had a second on June 8th.

COBBLEY'S BREEZE (VA) added another stakes placed finish in the Brookmeade Stakes on July 27th. The order of finish for the 2012 stakes race was exactly the same as the 2011 meet. The hard knocking Tom Cobbley mare also had two outstanding second place finishes in allowance company during the meet.

JAKE'S LIL MAN(VA), by Defrere, made his owner cry when he won on closing day July 28th. JAKE had the lead turning for home and we were all yelling "hold on Jake" while owner Darlene Bowlin of Powhatan was less than amused because she was watching the horse running in fourth place thinking it was Jake! A few jumps before the wire she realized Jake was in the lead by four lengths. That brought on the tears of joy. Great way to end the meet by winning a race for a great friend!!

FLATTERING BEA, by Flatter, won a Maiden Special Weight at Delaware by 8 3/4 lengths in her second start for owner and breeder James Arrison of Virginia. The good looking chestnut filly made a bid three wide and drew off steadily when roused in the drive.

MEDAGLIA DE PLATA, by Medallist, won a Maiden Special Weight at Charles Town by 5 lengths on June 27th for owner Kazdan Racing Stables of New York. The filly set the pace two wide and drew off around the turn and held well clear under a drive in the lane. A bettor would be happy with her as she paid \$151.60 for the win. She added a second in allowance company on August 17th at Charles Town.

IRONHEAD, by Changeintheweather, has rewarded his owner/breeder Bandco Farms (Don and Becky Smith) of North Carolina several times. On March 6th at Charles Town, IRONHEAD won by 8 1/4 lengths when he opened up and won in a hand ride. At Penn National on June 21st, IRONHEAD won by 3 3/4 lengths when he drew clear in the final 1/16th. Traveling back to West Virginia, but this time at Mountaineer Park on July 20th, IRONHEAD stalked the lead horse, wore down the rival and was drawing off and was in hand at the wire for a 3 3/4 length win. Love a horse that can travel, run off the pace or on the lead and WIN!

CASEY'S MONSTER, by Meadow Monster, won a Maiden Special Weight at Atlantic City on May 3rd for owner and breeder Fred H. Salter, Jr. of New Jersey. Casey vied between rivals and drew off in upper stretch.

RUNAWAY BEN, by Buckle Down Ben, won at Penn National on June 14th for owner Mountain View Racing LLC (Robert Winters). Ben vied for the lead at the start and then drew off in mid stretch for a 2 1/2 length win. Ben had a second at Presque Isle on July 7th. From the same stable E. ESPEE, by Changeintheweather, won a Maiden Special Weight on May 24th at Penn National by a neck. Up until this point he was keeping his conditions by running second in his first start on March 9th, then second on March 28, April 14 and May 4th before his win. Dare to Dream Stable LLC (Michael Faber) 's DEVOUT DIVA, by Holy Bull, broke her maiden on May 9th at Arlington Park when she won by two. DEVOUT DIVA celebrated the fourth of July with another win at Arlington Park. The filly steadily moved to challenge the pacesetter between foes and took over nearing the furlong marker and drew clear under firm handling for a 2 1/2 length win.

Our long time exercise rider, Denise Franklin 's Virginia homebred MORADA CHOICE, by Purple Passion, broke her maiden at Colonial Downs on July 28th by one length when she set the pace on the rail and was lightly urged. MORADA CHOICE added a second and third for breeder, owner and trainer Franklin of Hanover, Virginia.

ICY AND CIVIL, by Civilisation, won at Charles Town on March 9th for owner/breeder Reggetts Racing Stable (Stephen Reggetts) when shuffled back near the turn and made a bid and reached the front in late yards under wraps. Seconds on March 30th, May 26th and June 28th add to her list.

ASK LOUIS, by Louis Quatorze, broke his maiden at Charles Town on March 20th for breeder Stephen L. Reggetts.

MY BUDDY GARFIELD, by Buddha, continues to win at Beulah Park on April 17th by 7 3/4 lengths and then at River Downs on May 19th by 6 1/2 and also on June 7th , June 24th.

DAN'S GINGER, by Western Expression, won at Penn National on Mary 26th for breeder/owner Churchville Farm (Mr. and Mrs. Ronald Thoma of Pennsylvania). DAN'S GINGER had early position, came out of the turn rallied between horses and drove clear late.

MISTY'S SONG, by Domestic Dispute, won at Charles Town on June 1st for breeder James Arrison of Virginia. She was bumped while taking the lead and responded to moderate handling for a 4 1/2 length win.

LION ON THE RUN, by Lion Hearted, won again on May 27th and June 24th.

SAPPHIRE RIDGE, by Tiger Ridge, won by six lengths at Finger Lakes on July 12th, and by 2 1/2 lengths on July 23rd.

MISTY'S REBELLION, by Lion Hearted, won by two at Delaware Park on August 11th for owner/breeder James Arrison. Misty's Rebellion was second at Charles Town on April 3rd and at Colonial Downs on July 28th.

WHEREISJOHNSHOUSE, by Five Star Day, won a Maiden Special Weight at Delaware Park on August 13th for owner/breeder Daniel Borislow of Florida. The big bay colt was boxed in on the turn then swung wide to run down the leaders.

ROYAL FIREWORKS, by Bop, won an allowance race at Charles Town on August 17th and was second on June 13th for owners Paul and Barbara Brown of Hanover, Virginia

DAN'S LAST STAND, by Toccet, won at Parx Racing on August 19th to go with his seconds at Penn National on March 23rd, May 19th and July 15th at Parx Racing for breeder Daniel Borislow.
