**CONGRATULATIONS TO THE 2016 WVA BRED 2 YEAR OLD FILLY OF THE YEAR!**

**UNAQUOI**, by Gattopardo, won an allowance race at Pimlico on May 29 when she saved ground around the turn, was under brisk urging until the jockey dropped his whip in deep stretch but she held on to win by a nose. The gray filly won another allowance race on July 2nd at Mountaineer Park. On April 22, **UNAQUOI** ran third in the \$50,000 Its Binn Too Long Stakes at Charles Town. Congrats to owner and breeder Ray M. Pennington III and all the connections for the continued success of this nice filly!

**NEXT BEST THING**, by Stephen Got Even, made the Mid Atlantic Thoroughbred with a stakes win in the \$75,000 Conniver Stakes at Laurel on March 18th. The bay mare split horses leaving the backstretch, opened a clear lead down the stretch and held on for the win. On April 22nd at Laurel Park, **NEXT BEST THING** looped seven wide into the lane and finished willingly to run third in the \$75,000 Primonetta Stakes. This consistent and steady mare has run 58 times—13 wins, 9 seconds, and 9 thirds with total earnings of \$395,502.

**GUSTO AT DAWN**, by Buckle Down Ben, won the \$40,000 Steeplethon Stakes at the Virginia Gold Cup on May 6th for breeder Charles C. Conaway Jr. by six lengths.

**SAINT MAIN EVENT**, by Redeemed, won a Starter Allowance at Parx on May 29th for breeder and owner Daniel W. McConnell Sr. The bay filly raced wide and closed determinedly to run down the leader in time. She is still the leading money earner for Redeemed!

**Grasshoppin**, by Cat Thief, won an Allowance Race at Parx Racing on June 3rd when he opened a clear lead in mid stretch for owner and breeder Michael W. Jester. On August 5th, **Grasshoppin** was beaten by two necks when he ran third in the \$100,000 Robellino Stakes at Penn National on August 5th. Michael Jester has another runner in Moe Trouble, by Uncle Moe, who won an Allowance Race at Parx on April 10th when he drew away for the win.

You have to watch the replay of this race if you don't think some horses love to win! **ROBEY'S BOY**, by Maybry's Boy, owned by The Mares of Diomedes won an allowance race at Laurel Park on July 9th by a neck that paid \$91.40. **ROBEY'S BOY** lacked speed, raced in the two path on the turn, taken to the seven path in upper stretch, advanced outside horses to be second near the 1/16 pole when his rider misjudged the finish. **ROBEY'S BOY** continued under his own courage while his rider was oblivious to where the finish was and **ROBEY'S BOY** narrowly prevailed. Good horses overcome excuses!

**SCARLETT'S RANSOM**, by Denis of Cork, won at Laurel Park on April 8th win she lead all the way and hung on for the win for owners and breeders Nancy and Eric Rizer. She came back on June 11th and repeated her front running style but was never threatened while kept to her business to win by 5 1/2 lengths.

**GOOD SPORT**, by Hunt Crossing, won a Maiden Special Weight at Charles Town on April 28th for breeder and owner Vermont Farm. The chestnut gelding stalked the pace and drew clear to win by 8 lengths.

**NELLYSFORD**, by During, won a Maiden Special Weight at Charles Town on August 4th after overcoming a poor break for breeder and owner Ray M. Pennington III. This two year old filly is half sister to stakes winning **UNAQUOI**.

LADY JANE, by Bellamy Road, broke her Maiden in a Maiden Special Weight at Charles Town on August 10th for owner Ultra Championship Racing LLC. The gray filly came in at the start then accelerated toward contention while stalking the space, challenged, dueled three wide and took the lead midway and drew off to a 5 length lead.

**FIRST TIME OUT WINNERS:**

LETTHEMOOSELOOSE, by Ready's Image, won first time out at Parx Racing on May 6th for owner Brown Dog Racing Stable. The filly went after the leader from the outside with a furlong remaining then won going away. DANCING AFFAIR, by Peak Dancer, broke his maiden at first asking for breeders James L Driver and James Adams, and owner James L. Driver. The Maiden Special Winner chased the pace on the outside, drew to even terms, dueled in upper stretch and widened under a hand ride.

NOT A SECRET, by Orientate, added a win on April 28th for breeder Charles M. Wilson and owner Ray M. Pennington III at Charles Town with a driving finish. She traveled to Mountaineer on June 20th for an allowance race and won by two with a front running style.

Big sister SECRET OR NOT, by Orientate, won at Laurel Park for breeder Charles M. Wilson on May 6th when she stalked the pace and moved up between horses in the four path and got the bob.

Tigertail Ranch is the owner and breeder of WABASH CANNONBALL, by Grand Slam, who won at Evangeline Downs on May 17th when he pulled away for a 4 length win. In another race on June 28th, WABASH CANNONBALL was behind horses, steered out for a bid and finished with good resolve to get his picture taken again.

KAZZIE COTTONWOOD, by Lite the Fuse, broke her maiden at Pimlico on May 27th for owner and breeder Cottonwood Stable LLC. The filly was taken in hand early, awaited room and forged ahead under a steady drive.

PUTURSEATBELTON, by Bustin Stones, won for owner and trainer Anthony Aguirre at Laurel Park on June 23 when he tracked the leaders, moved to command and held firm. Off a claim from that race, PUTURSEATBELTON won a Starter Allowance at Laurel Park on July 2nd when he settled off pace, came around horses and dug in for the win.

Sam English has bred some winners. DEVIL'S GATE, by Luftikus, won at Charles Town on March 17th after being bumped in the gates. BOURBON AND BEER, by Pioneer of the Nile, won at Penn National on April 26th when he held on after a long drive. MIDNIGHT BLUE, by Midnight Lute, won at Charles Town on May 5th after racing in the five path, took the lead and dueled clear and lasted with all out encouragement. In his next race at Charles Town on May 19th, MIDNIGHT BLUE drove down the stretch and widened the lead to the wire.

DIRTY LAUNDRY, by Silver Train, broke her maiden at Pimlico on May 25th for owner James J. Loures. The filly broke alertly and quickly sprinted clear to set the pace and was under urging in the final strides for the win. R JOLLEY DREAMER, by Sahara Heat, won at Parx Racing on May 27th for breeder Kevin Cassidy when he drew off for the win.

LILY LUFTIKUS, by Luftikus, broke her maiden at Charles Town on April 8th for owner Donna Hayes with a three length win in a hand ride.

ANDY'S LOVE, by Andiron, has been picking up the checks with a win at Penn National on April 29th. Claimed out of that race, ANDY'S LOVE went on to win an allowance race at Penn National on July 27th when he reached the front just before a mile and ran clear late under urging.

HORSESHOE HARBOUR, by Bullsbay, broke his maiden at Pimlico on May 18th when he was clear after the break, set the pace and was under urging to win by 5 1/4 lengths.

HELISSIO SARASOLA, by Swain (IRE), won for breeder Ascot Stud, owner Ascot Stud and Michael S. Blake Sr. and trainer Michael Blake at Fort Erie on June 20th. The chestnut gelding was hustled from the inside, had the lead and prevailed at the end.

HADEEA, by Misbah, won at Penn National on July 20th for breeder Godstone Farm LP when he wasn't far back early, steadied while trying to split horses angled out and then ran clear through the late stretch.

SHEPHERD'S PRIDE, by Charitable Man, won at Albuquerque on August 9th for breeder James L. Driver. He edged clear for the win after closing in mid stretch.
