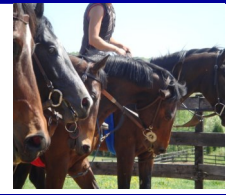

STAKES WINNERS!

FLATTERING BEA, by Flatter out of Wild Bea, put her name in bold black print with a stakes win at Charles Town Racetrack on September 22th. **FLATTERING BEA** settled off the pace in the three path, moved three wide entering the far turn, seized command at the quarter pole and drew clear under a drive for a 2 1/2 length win in the \$75,000 Miss Shenandoah Stakes. James Arrison is the owner and breeder of this nice filly. (Pictured)

KISSER N RUN, by Pleasant Tap out of Firm Kiss, also added the black print in a different fashion. After two wins at Colonial Downs on the flat, **KISSER N RUN** began her next career as a steeplechase horse when she broke her maiden first time out at Foxfields on September 30th in a 2 1/8 mile hurdle race by 2

1/4 lengths for owner Teddy Alexander of Florida. **KISSER N RUN**, under new ownership followed up with a stakes win in the \$75,000 Peapack Hurtle Stakes at Far Hills on October 20th with a 3 3/4 length victory.

DAN' LAST STAND, by Toccet, added a win on October 7th at Parx Racing when she chased three wide to be up in time by a head at the wire. **DAN'S LAST STAND** added a second at Parx Racing on October 13th before switching to Laurel Park on a raise to Allowance company. **DAN'S LAST STAND** circled the turn three wide, chased the pace, gained the lead inside the 1/8 pole then drove clear for a 1 1/2 length win. Daniel Borislow is the breeder of the chestnut filly.

NANSEYOUIN HEAVEN, by Beautiful Indy, won again for breeder Daniel Borislow at Parx Racing on September 10th when she was steadied along in tight entering the backstretch, took the lead, fell back then came on again and got the decision by a neck. The filly won again on September 24th at Parx Racing when she raced on the inside off the pace and took the lead in the final turn and drew off for a 4 length win.

RUNAWAY BEN, by Buckle Down Ben, won at Penn National on October 20th for owner Mountain View Racing LLC (Robert Winters). **BEN** was clear on the backstretch, stayed out from the rail and held under a drive for a 1 length win. **BEN** added a second place finish on December 5th at Penn National.

COWBOY CAT, by Cat Thief, broke his maiden on November 1st at Penn National for owner and breeder Bandco Farm (Don and Becky Smith). **COWBOY CAT** took command early, stayed inside around the turn and was clear to win by 4 lengths.

ICY AND CIVIL, by Civilisation, won at Charles Town on September 23rd for owner and breeder Stephen Reggets of Reggetts Racing Stable. **ICY AND CIVIL** raced off the pace early, advanced five wide around the turn, closed and was up in deep stretch for the win.

CRIMSON PAGE, by Glitz on Glitter, broke her maiden on October 27th for owner John C. Lester, III. The attractive chestnut filly set the pace on the first turn, was clear at the half mile pole and held on for the photo. Previous to the win, **CRIMSON PAGE** had seconds on September 6th, 27th and October 10th.

MISTY'S REBELLION, by Lion Hearted, won on October 31st at Charles Town when she set a pressured pace two deep, inched clear mid turn and was driven off from the top of the stretch for a 6 length win for owner/breeder James Arrison.

PUNTO D'ORO, by Point Given, broke his maiden by 7 1/4 lengths at Parx Racing on November 12th for owner Kazdan Racing Stables. **PUNTO D'ORO** duelled between foes, shook loose and drew out driving.

GUSTO AT DAWN, by Buckle Down Ben, won by 6 3/4 lengths at Mountaineer on November 18 when he was rated patiently off the pace, asked to split foes at the quarter pole, came three wide and drove home for the win.

FLATTERING ANDY, by Flatter, won an allowance race at Charles Town on November 21st for owner and breeder James W. Arrison. **FLATTERING ANDY** chased the pace off the rail, angled five wide and drew off mostly in hand.

CUT IN MAN, by Love of Money, won for owner and trainer Charles C. Conaway, Jr. on November 23rd at Charles Town. **CUT IN MAN** chased the pace inside, eased through the upper stretch and steadily closed to get up in late yards.

RISKY RED, by Devil His Due, won an allowance race at Penn National on November 28th when he came out in early stretch while rallying and then drew off.

Second Careers - Recently there has been a real revival for Off Track Thoroughbreds (OTTB's). Many organizations have been put together to retrain and re-home them. Horse shows have designated classes for them and show/hunt riders have embraced them. Karen Godsey grew up showing horses, with her main mount being an OTTB, and she has been able to retrain and properly home all of our guys when they are finished racing. One of our recent OTTB success stories is of a VA bred named Perfect Enough. After being retired because he wasn't competitive on the racetrack he has found his niche as a superb eventer. He was recently 3rd in the Area II Championships at Morven Park. We all know that not all horses will make it to the winners circle and many aren't fit for the breeding shed after racing. Having a good start on your horse not only prepares them physically and mentally for racing but also makes it so they have the opportunity to have a long, useful and enjoyable life afterwards.
